



State leaders will share how they are working to educate Georgians on all opportunities for health care coverage. Discussion will include updates on the Georgia Access and Pathways to Coverage programs, as well as other opportunities for coverage. Hospitals will learn how they can help promote these options in their communities and help patients take advantage.

Russel Carlson leads DCH, the state agency responsible for health care purchasing, planning and administration of Medicaid, PeachCare for Kids, and the State Health Benefit Plan, while regulating health care facilities across the state for compliance with existing state and federal laws. He previously served as chief health policy officer for DCH and vice president of government relations for the Georgia Health Care Association. He was also the highest-ranking civilian in the Georgia Department of Defense as the Deputy Adjutant General.



Kevin Tanner leads the Georgia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities, where he manages efforts by community providers to offer treatment and support services to help people with behavioral health challenges lead meaningful and fulfilling lives. Prior to his appointment to this role by Gov. Brian Kemp, he served as the County Manager of Forsyth. Gov. Kemp also appointed him as chair of the Behavioral Health Reform and Innovation Commission in 2019. Previously, he served four terms as a State Representative for District 9 and has a total of 32 years in public service.



Kathleen E. Toomey, M.D., M.P.H. is an epidemiologist and board-certified family practitioner, and was appointed commissioner of DPH by Gov. Brian Kemp in March 2019. In this role, Dr. Toomey oversees 159 county health departments in 18 health districts and various public health programs. She previously served as director of the Fulton County Department of Health and Wellness and led its transition to become the Fulton County Board of Health. She continued as district health director until December 2018. Dr. Toomey has held key leadership positions with the State of Georgia as well as



national and international leadership positions with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), including at the country director in Botswana. She also previously served as the director of the division of public health with the Georgia Department of Human Resources.
