Ovarian cancer ranks fifth in cancer deaths among women

MACON, Ga., Sept. 20, 2022 – In observance of Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month, Atrium Health Navicent encourages women to learn the risk factors and symptoms of ovarian cancer. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), cancer is a disease in which cells in the body grow out of control. When cancer starts in the ovaries, it is called ovarian cancer.

According to the American Cancer Society (ACS), ovarian cancer ranks fifth in cancer deaths among women, accounting for more deaths than any other cancer of the female reproductive system. A woman's risk of getting ovarian cancer during her lifetime is about 1 in 78. The ACS estimates that in 2022, about 19,880 women will receive a new diagnosis of ovarian cancer, resulting in 12,810 deaths. In Georgia, it's estimated that 610 new cases of ovarian cancer will occur in 2022, resulting in 410 deaths.

It's important to understand the risk factors for getting ovarian cancer. Women at a higher risk:

- Are middle-aged or older. About 90 percent of women who get ovarian cancer are over 40.
- Have close family members (such as a mother, sister, aunt or grandmother) who have had ovarian cancer
- Have a genetic abnormality called BRCA1 or BRCA2, or one associated with Lynch syndrome
- Have had breast, uterine or colon cancer
- Have endometriosis, a condition where tissue from the lining of the uterus grows elsewhere in the body
- Have never given birth or have had trouble getting pregnant

Although there are no reliable screening tests for ovarian cancer, annual appointments with your gynecologist can lead to early detection and treatment. It's important to talk to your doctor if you have one or more of the following:

- Vaginal bleeding (particularly if you are past menopause) or vaginal discharge that is not normal for you
- · Pain or pressure in the pelvic area
- Abdominal or back pain
- Bloating
- Feeling full too guickly, or difficulty eating
- A change in your bathroom habits, such as a more frequent need to urinate, or constipation

"It's vitally important that women stay current on annual well-woman visits so a physician can help detect ovarian cancer and other conditions early when treatment is most effective," said Dr. Felisha Kitchen, an Atrium Health Navicent OB-GYN and director of clinical practice for women's services. "If you're experiencing new gynecologic symptoms or have concerns, schedule an appointment with your primary care physician or gynecologist so further testing or screening can diagnose the cause."
