Franyutti joins Hamilton Wound and Hyperbaric Services

DALTON, Ga. (February 23, 2026) – Francisco Franyutti, MD, says what drives him is helping people get back to living their lives and making them feel whole again.

Franyutti recently joined Hamilton Wound and Hyperbaric Services as a wound care physician.

Franyutti received his medical degree from the University of Zagreb in Croatia. He completed a Family Medicine residency (specialized Wound Care and Hyperbaric Medicine track) at Hamilton Medical Center.

He says he's very supportive of lifestyle medicine. "I address people's diet and exercise, because there are typically underlying reasons that cause wounds or prevent them from healing," he says.

Collaboration with patients is very important to Franyutti. "I want to educate patients," he says. "I'm going to talk with patients about the root cause of their wounds and then work with them to help heal it."

Helping manage and heal wounds — and ultimately improve his patients' quality of life — is what motivates Franyutti. "A wound can be very isolating," he explains. "It often limits mobility and can cause significant pain. When patients come in after struggling with a nonhealing wound for months or even years, and we're able to help them reclaim their lives, that's deeply rewarding."
