Planning for the event has been overseen for the last two years by volunteer tri-chairs Angie Kennedy, Annie Stanley and Daphaney Teacher and their committees.

"Angie, Annie and Daphaney brought tremendous passion and leadership to every detail of this year's event," said Natalie Challen, president of the NGHS Auxiliary. "It's wonderful to see how they put their own spin on the event while continuing the legacy of all the tri-chairs who came before them over the last 30 years."

The three-day event kicked off with the Preview Party on Thursday night with food, entertainment and a live auction. Some of the items available to bid on included a guitar autographed by Taylor Swift, a two-day quail hunt at the Dorchester Hunting Preserve in Savannah, and a seven-day luxury safari through Northern Tanzania.
