

Small Business, Big Impact: Patel Family Supports Southeast Georgia Health System Breast Cancer Programs

BRUNSWICK, Georgia: November 20, 2025 – Less than one percent of men are diagnosed with breast cancer, but that doesn't make the impact on patients and families any less devastating. Prem Patel was studying pre-medicine when his father was diagnosed with terminal breast cancer. "My father wanted to see my sister Khyati's wedding," Prem recalls. To fulfill his father's dying wish, Prem left school, moved back to Brunswick, and along with his brother-in-law Jaymin Patel, made a traditionally elaborate Indian wedding happen in record time.



After losing the family patriarch, Prem stayed in Brunswick to help his mother. He and Jaymin also started a business, KJ Mart and Fountain Package Store at 2300 Norwich Street. Even before the official opening, the Patels honored their father's memory by hosting a Breast Cancer Awareness Month fundraiser on October 24, 2025. The event raised \$1,183 for Southeast Georgia Health System Foundation to support patient services at the Cancer Care Center.

"The Patels understand the impact of breast cancer. When small businesses like theirs hold fundraisers, they help get our message out in the community. Every single dollar raised helps us provide free and low-cost mammograms," says Bryan Thompson, interim director, Foundation.

"Donations raised by community fundraisers and events like the ARTrageous Bras are especially important now," says Thompson. "Not-for-profit hospitals operate on tight margins. With federal and state health care funding cuts, we are and will continue to feel the pinch."

The Patel's fundraiser not only connected their new business with the community; it honored their father by carrying on the family

tradition of giving back. As Prem says, "We've all got to work together."
