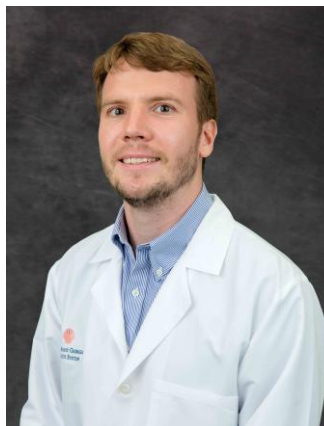
Southeast Georgia Health System Adds Two New Neurologists to the Brunswick Campus

BRUNSWICK, Georgia: September 10, 2025 – Southeast Georgia Health System is pleased to announce that neurologists Andrew Guidry, MD and Cyril Lukianov, MD, have joined Southeast Georgia Physician Associates–Neurology, located on the Health System's Brunswick Campus 2500 Starling Street, Suites 501 and 503 respectively. Both physicians bring exceptional expertise in the diagnosis and treatment of neurological conditions, expanding access to specialized care for residents of southeast Georgia and the surrounding region.



A graduate of Duke University with bachelor's degrees in Biology and Psychology—both with a concentration in neuroscience—Guidry earned his Doctor of Medicine from the Marshall University Joan C. Edwards School of Medicine in Huntington, West Virginia. He completed his neurology residency at Emory University School of Medicine in Atlanta and pursued advanced fellowship training in sports neurology at The Sandra and Malcolm Berman Brain & Spine Institute in Baltimore, Maryland.

Guidry specializes in concussion management, moderate traumatic brain injury, whiplash, and neurological issues affecting athletes. His clinical experience spans patients from age seven through adulthood, including professional and Olympic athletes. He has served as a ringside physician, Division I contact sports consultant, and neurologist for professional sports teams such as the New Orleans Pelicans and Baltimore Ravens. In addition to patient care, Guidry is a previous educator, speaker, and fellowship director, with numerous publications and presentations to his credit.



Lukianov earned his Bachelor of Science in Chemical and Biomolecular Engineering with highest honors from the Georgia Institute of Technology in Atlanta, Georgia before completing his Doctor of Medicine at the Medical College of Georgia at Augusta University. He completed his neurology residency at the Medical University of South Carolina, where he was Chief Resident from 2024-2025.

In addition to his clinical training, Lukianov has an extensive background in biomedical research, including published work on protein nanocarriers for intracellular antibody delivery. His research portfolio spans topics such as stroke in young adults, muscle mitochondrial capacity in older adults, and targeted drug delivery. Fluent in English and Russian, with intermediate proficiency in German, Lukianov brings a global perspective to neurological care and a passion for patient-centered medicine.

The arrival of Guidry and Lukianov comes at a critical time for the region. The Golden Isles has faced a shortage of neurologists in recent years, limiting timely access to diagnosis and treatment for conditions such as migraines, seizures, movement disorders, multiple sclerosis and traumatic brain injury. Their addition to the Brunswick Campus team will significantly increase appointment availability, reduce wait times, and help ensure that more patients receive the specialized neurological care they need close to home.
