BRUNSWICK, Georgia: March 29, 2020 – On March 30, Southeast Georgia Health System will celebrate National Doctors Day by paying tribute to the physicians that impact our lives. During the past year, physicians worldwide have faced the pandemic challenge with resilience and bravery, oftentimes prioritizing their patients above their own health and safety. FaithWorks recently expanded its healthcare and poverty ministry to Camden County by assuming the operations management of Helping Hands, a long time food pantry of Saint Marys United Methodist Church.
